



Title: California Assembly Bill 2912

Subject: Consumer Warranties

Summary:

California Assembly Bill 2912 amends the Song-Beverly Consumer Warranty Act to prohibit the commencement of an express warranty earlier than the date the consumer receives the good.

Current law defines consumer good as “any new product or part thereof that is used, bought, or leased for use primarily for personal, family, or household purposes, except for clothing and consumables.”

This bill would impact the effective date of service contracts where coverage begins when the express warranty ends.

The bill is effective 7/1/2023.
