



Title: Wisconsin Senate Bill 655

Subject: Service Contracts

Summary:

This bill has been signed by the Governor and will be effective February 7, 2022.

Wisconsin Senate Bill 655 is legislation pursued by MVPPA. The bill amends the definition of “service contract” to expressly authorize key or key fob repair or replacement and excess wear and use coverage.

The bill also states that a Vehicle Protection Product warrantor is not required to obtain approval from the Office of the Commissioner of Insurance for the terms of a warranty.

The bill also amends the definition of vehicle protection product to clarify that it does not include a chemical or substance applied to an exterior or interior surface of a vehicle to maintain and protect the vehicle's appearance.
